Dear BENEFACTORS and FRIENDS,

This newsletter comes loaded with a great variety of news, from health issues, through donations of materials, prizes, sports and preparations for the celebration of the Khmer New Year.

*** HEALTH ***

First of all, we would like to inform you that the month of March has been vital in the subject of health among our children and young residents. On March we attended two medical visits in Phonm Penh, to confirm the respective prescriptions that in both cases ended in surgical intervention specified here: - P, 16 years old, has been in the Children Surgical Center to be operated on both ears, given the discomfort that he has suffered for years due to perforated eardrums. After a day of postoperative observation in the hospital facilities, he was sent back home, having to return in mid-May to check again.



- B, aged 9, was treated at the National Pediatric Hospital to undergo a surgical intervention on the palate, in what is technically called an "ABG" Alveolar Bone Graft. Grafting hip bone on the upper gum, provides teeth with bone mass in which to develop. He remained 5 days under observation after the intervention and must return at the end of April and again at the end of June.



We would like to take the opportunity to thank all the health personnel and particularly the medical teams in both hospitals, for the great work they have been doing day by day, treating many cases and doing so without profit. Many thanks to all the organizations that have collaborated so that these expenses and other surgical interventions are possible.





- We continue with education on oral hygiene. The dental clinic team teaches prevention through proper brushing and maintenance of damaged parts. To date, 7 fillings, 7 polishing, 2 crowns, 5 extractions of baby teeth and 2 extractions of highly damaged pieces have been performed.

This wonderful initiative could not go unnoticed in the eyes of the Headquarters of CAE in Canada. They promoted a solidarity contest and our dear CRISTINA has opted for the third place, receiving a prize for TOGETHER FOR CAMBODIA.
